Begonia rex 'escargot' is an evergreen perennial that is grown for its attractive foliage that has a basal arrangement at the base of the stem. The pattern of the leaf is made because of the spiraling green and silver colors. It makes for a good houseplant and works well with pots, it requires high humidity well-drained soil.
