Hoya compacta, a succulent vine that produces clusters of star-shaped waxy flowers like the Hoya carnosa, is distinguished from other plants by its curly leaves. The flowers form round balls and one can find around 30-50 flowers in one umbel. An interesting fact about the flowers is that they last for only about one week.
