Aquilegia 'Blue Star' has a long-spurred periwinkle-blue flower.

Aquilegia 'Blue Star' performs best in dappled sun to partial shade and evenly moist, nutrient-rich soil with good drainage. An ideal choice for woodland plantings and mixed borders, the bright blossoms of 'Blue Star' also make excellent cut flowers.
