Gaillardia pulhela is native to Southeastern United States, South-Central United States, Southwestern United States, and Mexico. Its proper growing conditions are full sunlight.

Firewheel or indian blanket is a popular annual flower. The hairy stem usually becomes woody at the base late in the season.
