

Anigozanthos flavidus

(Tall Kangaroo Paw)

It typically forms a basal rosette of slender, arching, strap-shaped, medium green leaves, from them grows the flower stalks that carry tubular greenish-yellow hairy flowers, colors vary and can be pink or red. It prefers sandy loam soil, needs proper drainage, must be protected from strong winds
