Burningbush is a fast-growing annual, that grows in full sun, well drained soil, and needs average watering. It's drought tolerent.

In non-native areas it's sometime considered invasive because it re-seads its self frequently. Can be used for hedges or topiaries, as well as in containers. In fall, the folliage changes its color to become burgundy.
