A compact shrub with light green opposite leaves and fragrant, honey scented, white blossoms that appear late spring early summer and attract bees butterflies and or birds. after which comes the dry brown fruits while in the winter the foliage may turn burgundy

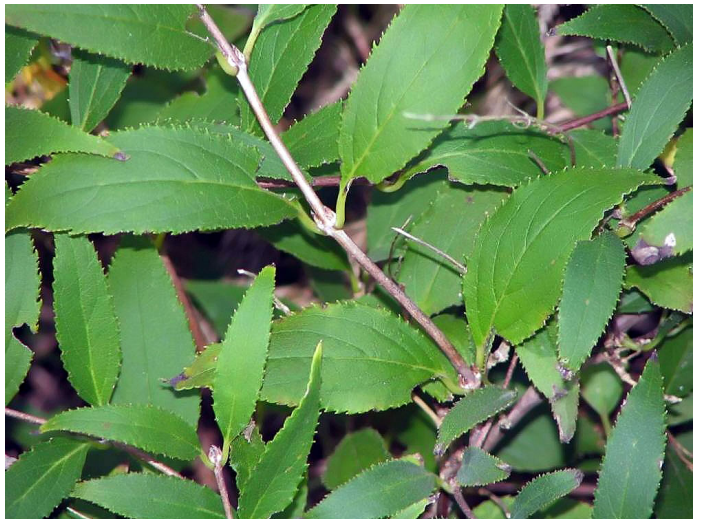
