Choisya ternata

(Mexican mock orange, Mexican orange blossom)

A broadleaf evergreen shrub that is dense and rounded. Leaves are opposite and palmately compound with 3 leaflets that are long, glossy, rounded and green; when crushed they emit a pungent odor. Flowers fragrant, white in 3-6 flowered-clusters at end of shoots. Blooms for an extended period. It prefers well-drained, acid, moist soil and is rabbit tolerant and attracts butterflies and bees

The cultivar ‘Sundance’ has golden yellow foliage and grows at a slower rate
